A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SUNRISE, FLORIDA, TO APPROVE THE “STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION UTILITY WORK BY HIGHWAY CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT (AT UTILITY EXPENSE)” AND TO AUTHORIZE THE UTILITIES DIRECTOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on January 12, 2016, the City Commission approved a joint grant application with the City of Weston to construct bicycle lanes along Weston Road, from State Road 84 south to Indian Trace Blvd.; and

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2021, the City Commission approved Resolution No. 16-2-21-A Highway Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) outlining the scope of the project, identifying the parties' responsibilities and allowing FDOT to construct the project within the City's right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, in order for FDOT to deliver the project, FDOT requires the City of Sunrise, as a Utility Agency Owner (UAO) with facilities existing within the project limits, to enter into a “Utility Work by Highway Contractor Agreement (at Utility Expense).”

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SUNRISE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The “State of Florida Department of Transportation Utility Work by Highway Contractor Agreement (at Utility Expense)” (Agreement) for the Weston Road project is hereby approved. A copy of the Agreement is attached hereto and made a part of this Resolution as Exhibit A.

Section 2. The Utilities Director or his designee is hereby authorized to execute the Agreement. The Utilities Director shall provide a copy of the executed Agreement to the City Clerk.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
