A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SUNRISE, FLORIDA, APPROVING AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE “AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE RIDESHARING PROGRAM ASSESSMENT STUDY – CITY OF SUNRISE” BETWEEN THE CITY OF SUNRISE AND RAFTELIS FINANCIAL CONSULTANTS, INC.; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on December 9, 2025, via Resolution No. 25-186, the Sunrise City Commission approved an “Agreement to Provide Ridesharing Program Assessment Study – City of Sunrise” (Agreement) with Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc. (Raftelis) to conduct a study and develop a special assessment program to recover the Freebee Sunrise program’s operating costs through the levy of non-ad valorem special assessments, and to evaluate user-fee options as a potential supplemental revenue source; and

WHEREAS, during the course of the study, it was determined that the assessment program would benefit from an economic analysis demonstrating that the Freebee services provide a quantifiable economic benefit to properties within the assessment district and Raftelis has agreed to perform the economic analysis; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the Agreement is necessary to add the economic analysis to the existing scope of services and to increase the contract amount accordingly.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SUNRISE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Amendment No. 1 to the “Agreement to Provide Ridesharing Program Assessment Study – City of Sunrise” (Amendment) is hereby approved. A copy of the Amendment is attached hereto and made a part of this Resolution as Exhibit A.

Section 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute the Amendment.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
